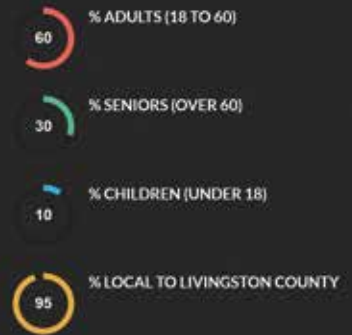
**2. Sponsor a Chair:** To sponsor a chair for the season is \$200 for the LYO and \$400 for the LSO. (The price difference is because the LYO plays two concerts per season and LSO plays four concerts.) When you sponsor a chair, you will be able to choose the section (Violin I, Bass, Flute, etc.,) and also the name of the chair (i.e., "The Ruth Jones Memorial Chair"). Your sponsorship is indicated in the program and you also receive a business-card sized advertisement in the program for each applicable concert. You are also listed as a sponsor on our website.
